**Project Abstract** 

Tracking the devices during various medical interventions is often needed. Optical tracking has high accuracy in tracking medical devices however fails in case of loss of line of sight. This issue can be solved by electromagnetic tracking system but it suffers from interference issues. Hence this project aims to combine these two systems to provide better tracking accuracy during medical application.

# **Background and Motivation**

This project is part of large scale EU projects EndoTOFPET-US and PicoSEC where tracking and navigation of endoscopic PET is very crucial task. The project has high clinical value in providing novel diagnostic and therapeutic imaging tool.

## Student's Tasks Description

Work within custom made C++ based software framework called CAMPCOM to synchronize

optical tracking data with magnetic tracking data in order to fuse information from two different tracking sources. This is very good opportunity to learn two kinds of important tracking systems and related software development for medical application.
