Project Abstract

Simple 1D signals are used in a wide variety of medical application, such as ECG, EEG, respiratory surrogates, spatial relations or other vital signs. In order to compare multiple patients, these signals need to be compared and matched.

Student's Tasks Description

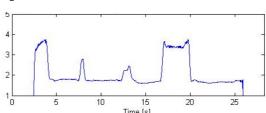
The student will research literature on biological signal matching and present several approaches towards probabilistic and dynamic signal matching. Together with the supervisory team, one or more suitable algorithms will be chosen and first implemented in Matlab. Furthermore, the best performing algorithm will be implemented in C++ (ideally for GPU computation).

Technical Prerequisites

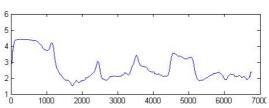
Algorithm design in Matlab, final implementation in C++ (optionally CUDA or openGL).
