#### **Project Abstract**

Augmented Reality systems are useful for edutainment system: 3D visualization tells us more than 2D visualization does and people can keep their motivation with edutainment systems rather than education systems.

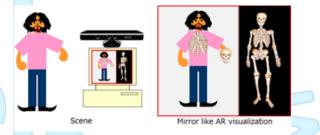


Figure 1: Our AR edutainment system

The aim of this project is to develop a medical augmented reality system for learning human anatomy, especially the structure of bones, as shown in Fig. 1. The project is managed by following agile development style [1].

#### **Background and Motivation**

There exist several tools for learning human anatomy [2-4]. One of the state-of-the-art learning materials is 3D visualization text book [2,3]. The feature of such material is to visualize data in 3D so that the users can get more information than we do from 2D one. Edutainment systems encourage their users to learn actively by providing video game like systems [4].

The motivation of this project is to develop a more intuitive system for learning human anatomy by introducing the concept of augmented reality and using a Kinect. Augmented reality concepts provide 3D visualization and the possibility of developing edutainment systems while Kinects let us interact with computers by gestures. Therefore, we can develop more intuitive visualization and interaction edutainment system.

#### Student's Tasks Description

Students will join an ongoing project that is a collaborative work between the chair and Keio University, Japan. We have already developed basic augmented reality visualization function. The missing part for prototype release is (1) gesture recognition, (2) puzzle game component, (3) improvement of visualization function.

The project is fully managed by following agile development style. Each member is assigned different tasks according to his/her role. For example, one contributes as a developer while

We hope everything will be finished around new year and we use the remaining time for optional staffs. Our tentative plan is as follows:

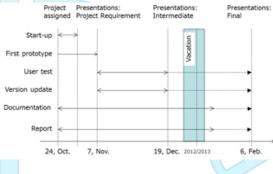


Figure 2: Rough time schedule
