#### **Project Abstract**

The goal of this thesis is to implement a skeleton animation for an augmented reality magic mirror.

# **Background and Motivation**

We have previously shown an augmented reality (AR) magic mirror. It creates the illusion that a user standing in front of the system can look inside the own body. We now want to build a system for education of human anatomy using augmented reality visualization.

The system uses the Kinect which tracks a user and provides us with the skeleton joint. A CT dataset is augmented onto the user. One problem here is that the CT dataset is rigid. So if the user moves the arm, the overlay will not be correct. We want to use a polygonal model instead of the CT. The goal of this project is to animate a computer model based on the joint we receive from the Kinect In order to do that, the polygonal model has to be processed such the an animation of the skeleton becomes possible.

#### **Student's Tasks Description**

Extract bones from a 3D polygonal model of human anatomy. Implement a so called rigging, where the skeleton is moved based on data obtained from the Kinect.

# **Technical Prerequisites**

The students should have basic knowledge in C++ or C# and OpenGL or DirectX.
