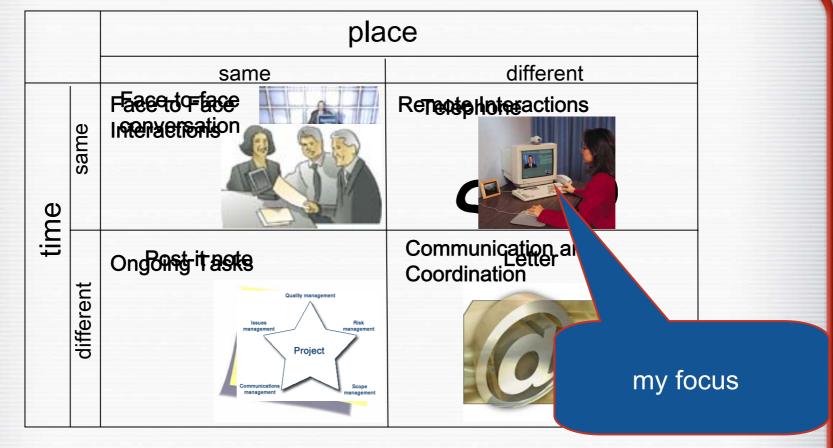

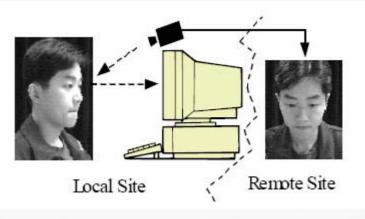


Video-conferencing

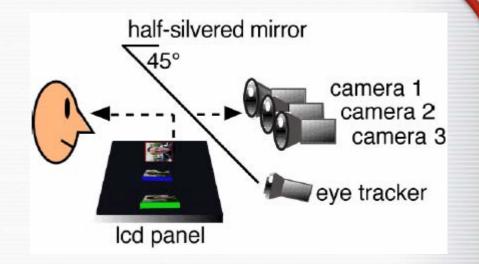

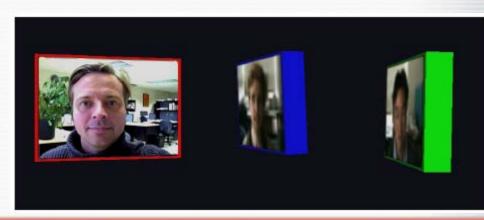

 rotated

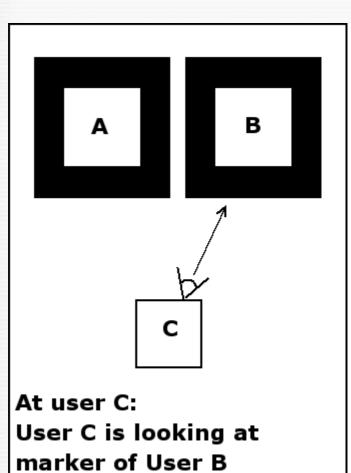


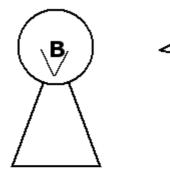


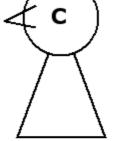
my idea

- desktop conferencing
- avatars in your familiar workspace
- capturing the users gaze and rotate the avatar accordingly



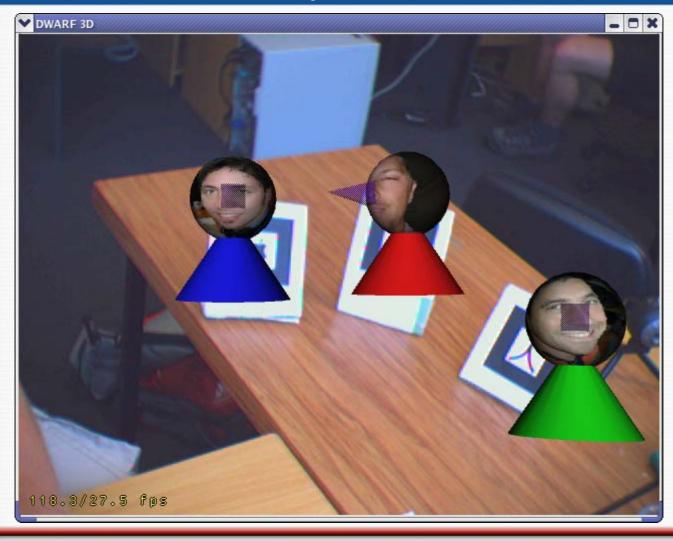






At user A: Avatar C is rotated towards user B

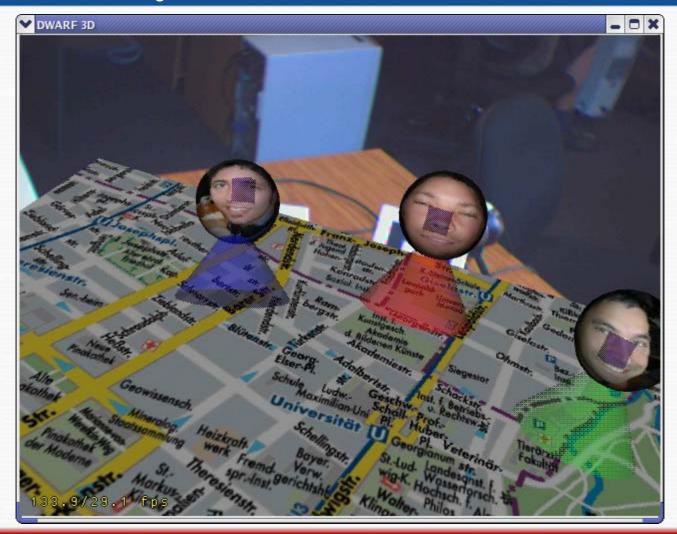
my idea



my idea (extension)

- introducing a dedicated marker as represent for a shared working object
- calculating at which exact point the user is gazing on the shared object
- using this information for visualizing at the other users shared object

my idea (extension)



software design aspects

- implemented with the DWARF framework
- three main components
 - ViewAnalyser
 - Registration
 - Drawer



ViewAnlyser

calculate out of the view

- at which marker/user
- where at the shared object

ARToolkit translation matrix Eye vector coordinates in the marker plane

Registration

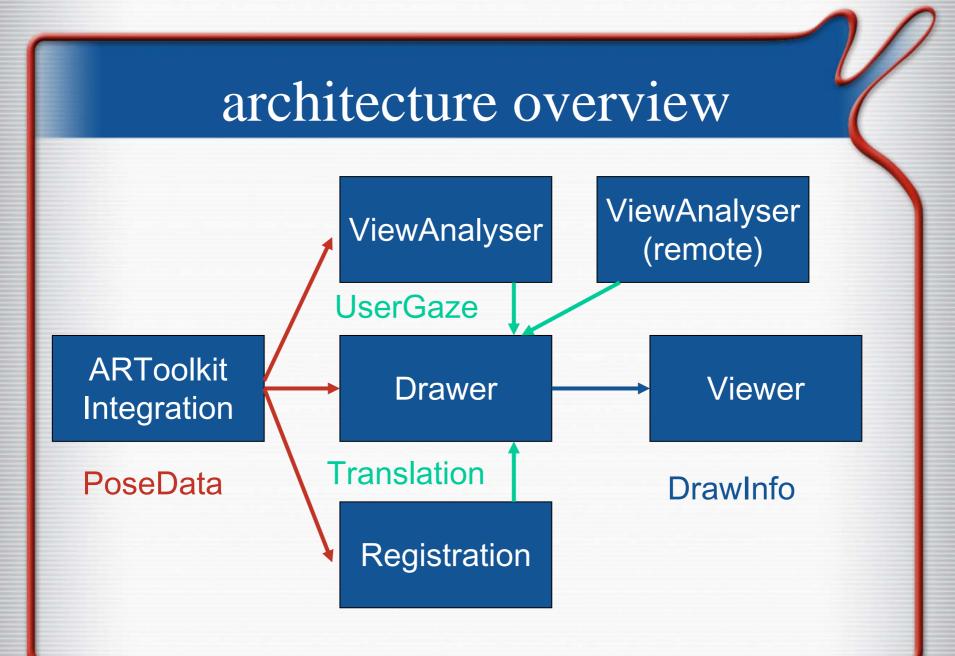
- registration between markers is necessary
 - imagine only one marker is visible
 - but you have to rotate the avatar

save this vector in M1 coordinate system

M2

Drawer

- retrieve different kinds of information
- combines them to a scene
- and controls the Viewer component
