The method, hardware and software

Method

Corneal reflections - find the rotation of the eye based on reflection of Near-Infrared (NIR) light using irregularities in its spherical shape

Hardware

Smartek NIR/Grayscale 1600x1200px, 25fps camera **Falcon** ring NIR LED illumination LAN switch and a computer running Windows

Software

FRAMOS C++ framework **MATLAB** for intrinsic camera calibration




Figure: NIR light reflection and eye schematic




Figure: FRAMOS toolkit

Optimistic timeline




Figure: Gantt time-chart
