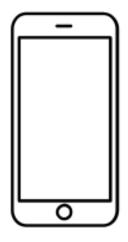

 - Medical applications (attention or active estimation)



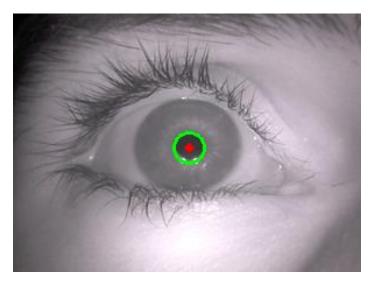

 - Works well when algorithm starts in the eye

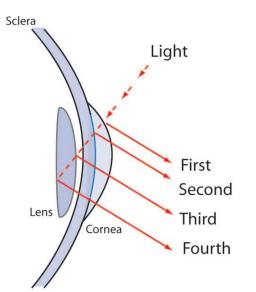

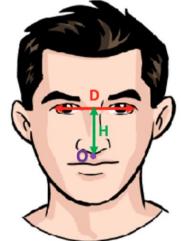
Task and future development

 - Glint
 - Head pose
- Linear algebra to calibrate
