Motivation

gesture-based input can mean many things

touchscreens ("multitouch")
input from multiple users
input with multiple fingers/hands
multiple conventional pointers

tangible interfaces
everyday items
mobile devices
fiducial markers

free-air gestures assisted (Wiimote) unassisted (Kinect) th Wilmotes...

Imagine porting an iPad app to a wall display with Wiimotes... => is there a common denominator for these interfaces?

Motivation

What is a gesture?

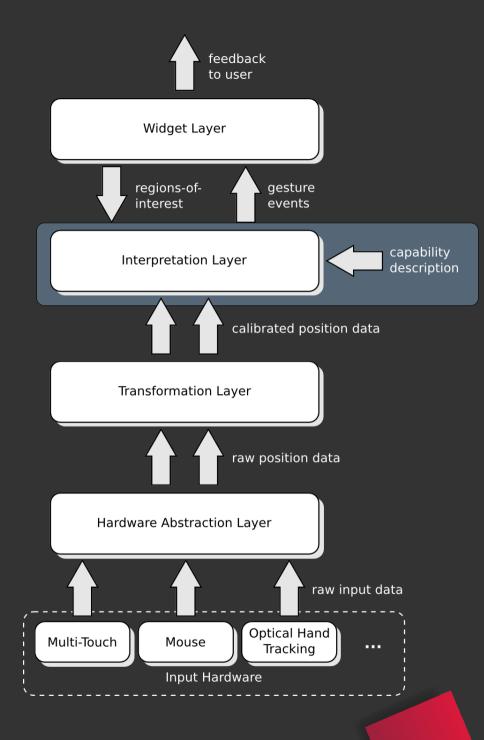
common gesture descriptions allow...
user customization
faster development

difficult question: what is a gesture?

answer within this context:

any motion(s) which the user executes
to achieve a certain response

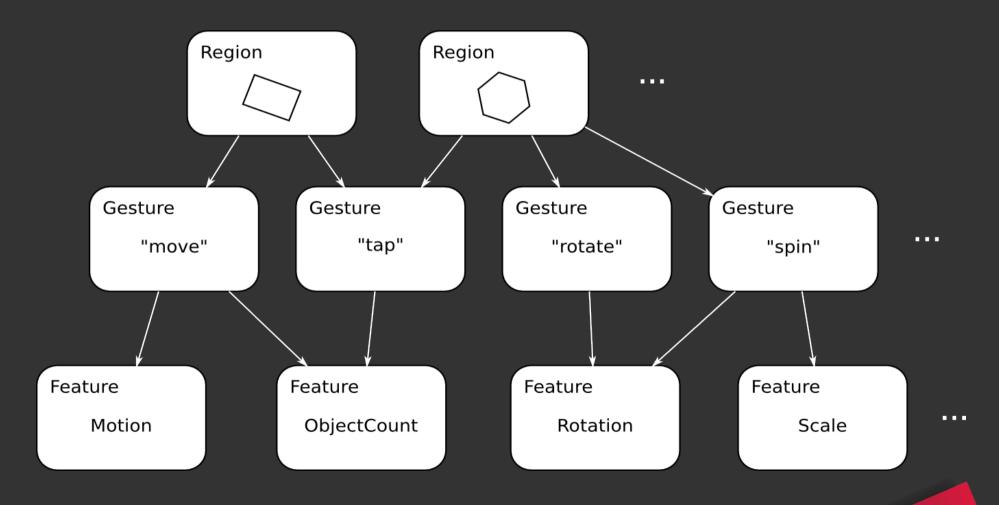
directly leads to the next question: how can these motions be described?



Concepts

Abstract Description of Gestures

Three core elements: Regions, Gestures, Features



Concepts

Abstract Description of Gestures

Regions:

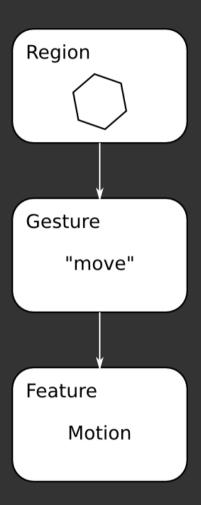
spatial areas defined in reference coordinates extension of "traditional" WIMP-UI window objects

Gestures:

sequences of features, either ... pre-defined by capability description or ... customized by application

Features:

geometrical/mathematical properties of input data, e.g.: motion vector relative rotation travelled path further classification through filters and constraint values



Concepts

Examples of Available Features

Motion – average motion vector

Rotation – rotation around center of mass

Scale – scaling w.r.t. center of mass

Path – recognize "shape-based" gestures

ObjectCount – number of objects inside region
ObjectDimensions – describes shape of object
ObjectOrientation – rotation relative to reference frame
ObjectPosition – absolute position of object
ObjectID – unique ID (e.g., fiducial marker) of an object

Examples

Rotation Gesture

simple example: "rotate" gesture (contains one Rotation feature)

```
rotate default RelativeObjectRotation 255 0 6.28 0
Name Flags Feature Mask Lower... Upper limit Result
```

result value generated through...
multi-finger rotation *or*object rotation *or*mouse wheel *or* ...



Examples

Composite Gesture

slightly more complex example: horizontal swipe with two fingers

Result (only when constraints match): (3-vector, integer) = motion vector + object count

mapping is dependent on...
hardware capabilities
user preferences

=> application doesn't have to care
