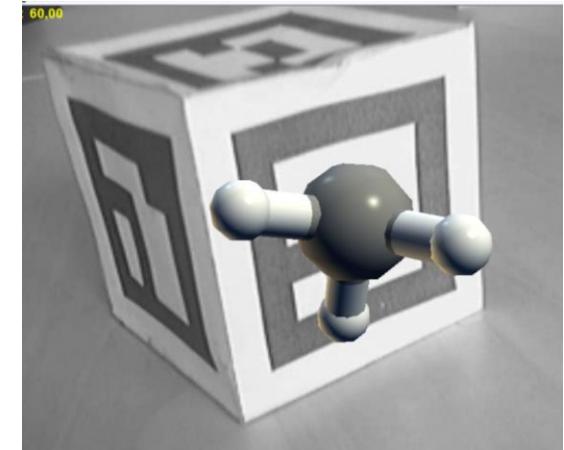
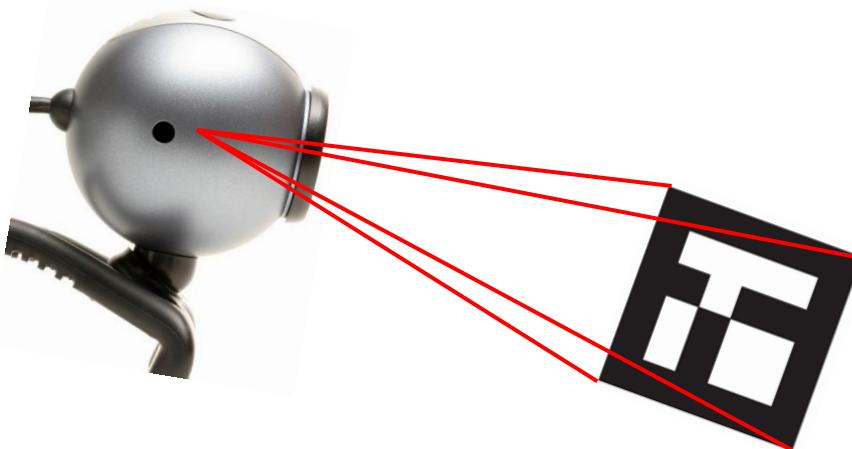
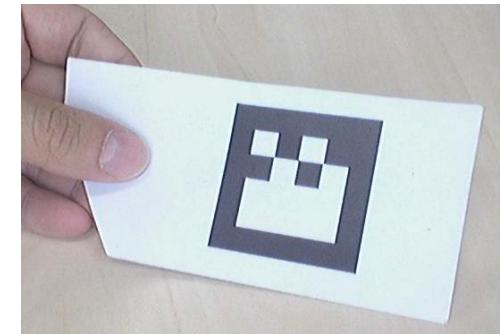
Augmented Reality Technique

- Real + Virtual
- Interactive in real-time
- Registered in 3 Dimensions



Augmented Reality - Technology

- Manipulation of real objects (markers)
- Webcam takes picture of the markers
- Calculating the position and orientation of the markers
- Augment the picture with virtual objects





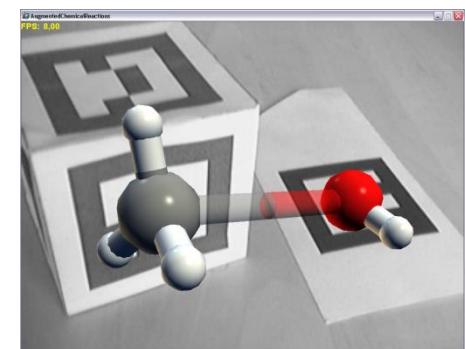
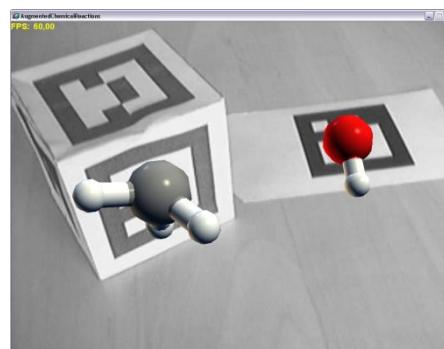
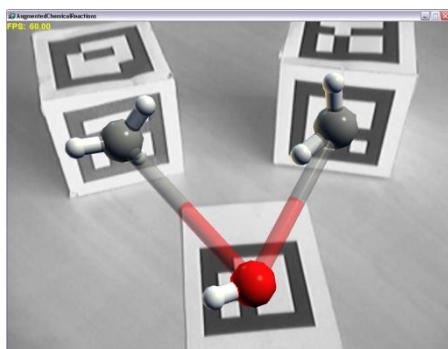
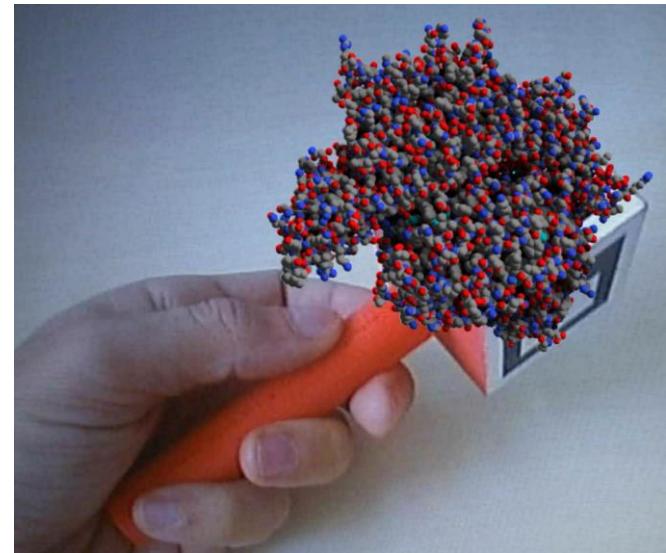

Question:

Does Direct Manipulation Help?

Evaluation: Setup

- 13 Students aged 14-15 (8th grade Gymnasium)
- Compare:
 - Augmented Chemical Reactions (ACR) (Direct 3D User Interface)
 - Jmol (Mouse, Keyboard Interaction)
- 10 different Molecules
 - Sulfur S_8 , Methane CH_4 , Ethanol C_2H_5OH , Acetic acid $C_2H_4O_2$,
 - Benzene C_6H_6 , Hydrogen sulfide H_2S , Phosphor P_4 , Phosphorus trisulfide PF_3 , Hexane C_6H_{14} , Carbon tetrabromide CBr_4
- 2 Computer Rooms

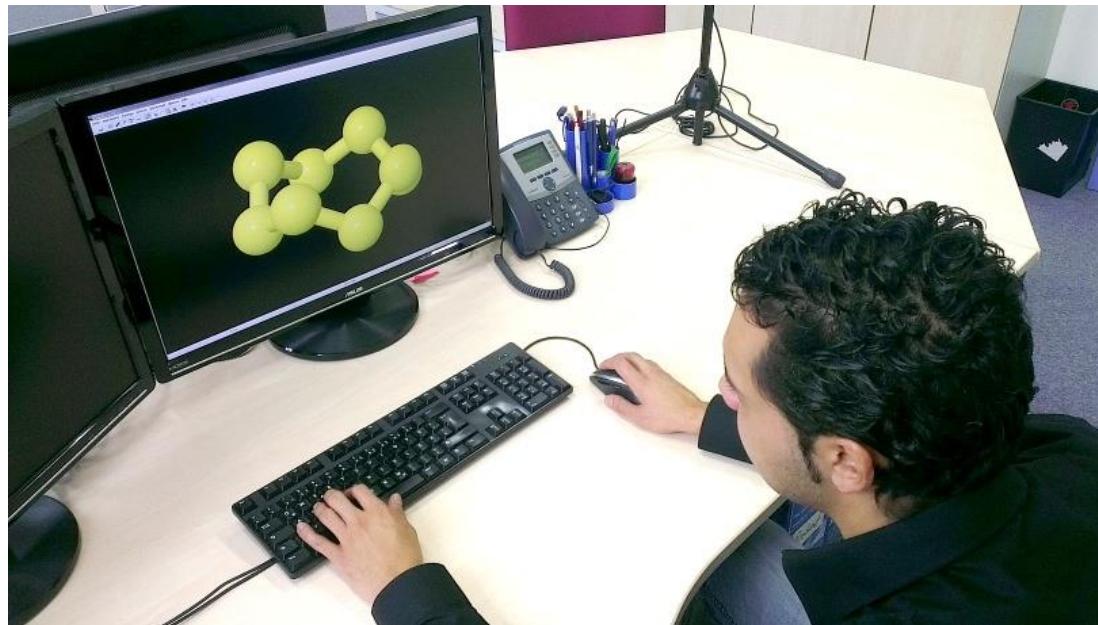

- Keyboard and Mouse



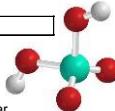

Evaluation: Measure Improvements

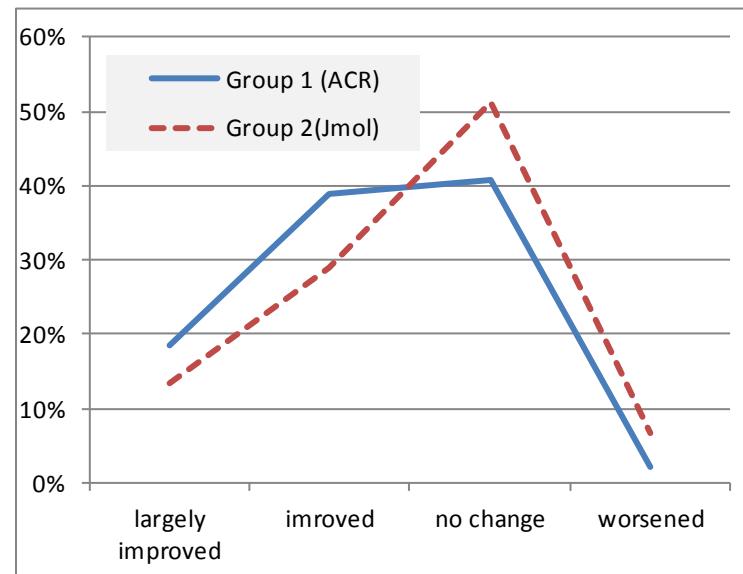
Compare Clay Models BEFORE and AFTER the use of the Application.

- Large Improvement (2 Points)
- Normal Improvement (1 Point)
- No Improvement (0 Points)
- Worsened (-1 Point)



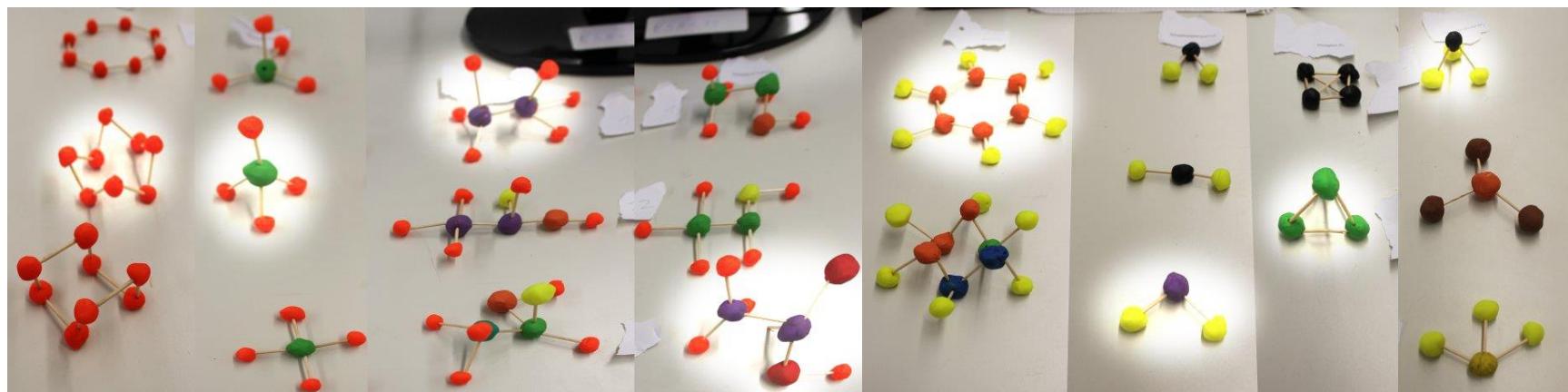
Results of Clay Molecule Improvements

- ACR (direct manipulation) significant better than Jmol (mouse, keyboard)
- More improvements with the ACR Group than with the Jmol Group



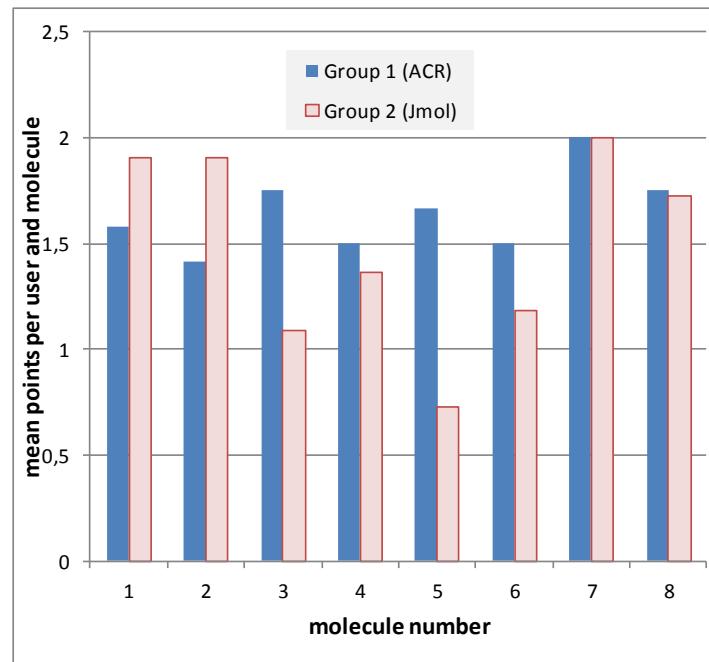
Evaluation: Choose correct Molecule

- Table with prebuilt Clay Molecules
- 2-3 Versions of 8 Molecules
- Correct Version (2 Points), Nearly Correct (1 Point), Wrong (0 Points)



Results of Picking the correct Version

- Interesting: Group ACR worse in first two Molecules
- Possible cheating (?) of Jmol on the first two Molecules

Discussion

Significant Improvement

Direct manipulation leads to a better spatial understanding
Mouse and keyboard results in mental distraction from the molecular shape
